To coordinate with this idea, FCCU chose to sponsor the business center located in the Sunshine Hospitality Home. Much like a computer lab, the First Community Credit Union Business Center space has computers, telephones, webcams and internet access. This is a place where families can connect with those unable to be there by updating their Caring Bridge/Facebook/Twitter page, calling or emailing loved ones, or visiting with them face to face with the webcam. It will also allow a family to stay together if they are able to work remotely.
